The essence of 2-1-1 is in its simplicity.

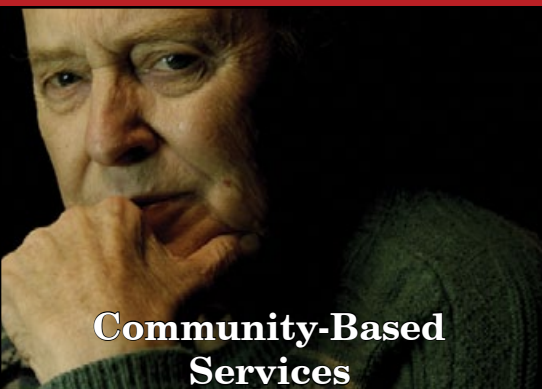
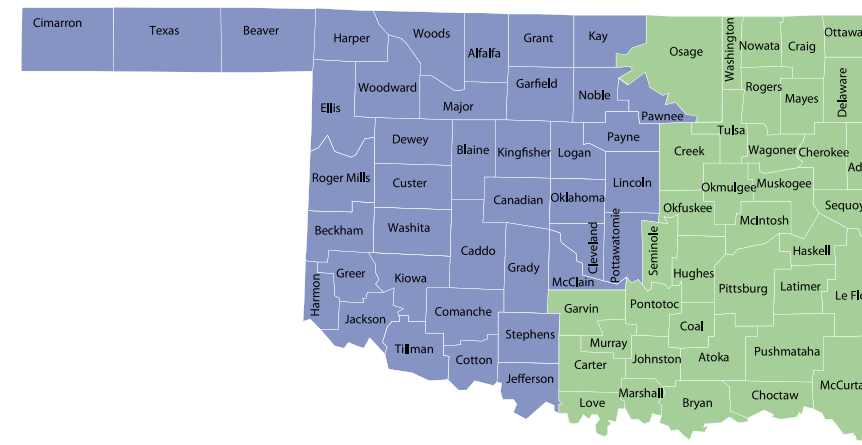
2-1-1 is available to everyone across the state and is easy to remember.

2-1-1 has proven itself time after time as an invaluable resource after a disaster.

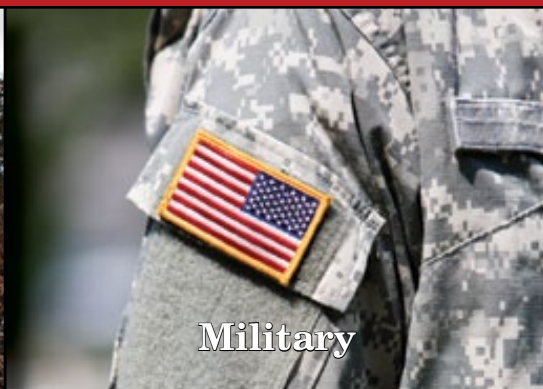
